

## **Explosive Demolition of Rugeley Power Station (Turbine Hall and Deaerator Bay)**

### **Q and A's**

#### **What is being demolished and when?**

- At approximately 10am on 28th November 2019, the fourth controlled collapse demolition event using explosives will take place at Rugeley Power Station. The collapse will bring down the Turbine Hall and Deaerator (DA) Bay.
- The structures are predominantly steel with the Turbine Hall 30m and the DA Bay 73m high.
- Both structures are away from the main gate and barely visible from offsite.
- The structures are located within the power plant footprint.

#### **What is the impact on the local community / businesses?**

- There will be negligible disruption to the local community and businesses.
- The exclusion zone for the demolition event is within the Power Station boundary and due to the size and proximity of the structures, road closures will not be required.
- Local evacuations will not be necessary

#### **Will you be closing any local roads?**

- There will be no road closures for this demolition event.

#### **Will the demolition be noisy or dusty?**

- The controlled collapse will last for approximately 10 seconds and as the structures are made from metal there will be some noise for a very short space of time.
- Every effort will be made to reduce the amount of dust generated from the blowdown and road sweepers will be available if required.
- Adjacent businesses will not be affected by this demolition.

#### **Do we need to close our windows?**

- There may be some dust immediately following the controlled collapse, but it is highly unlikely to travel outside of the exclusion zones and into any residential areas.
- The dust is not dangerous to public health and as such the local community has no need to worry about going outside or leaving windows open.

**Where is the best vantage spot to see the explosive demolition? Will you let local people watch?**

- The structure due to be demolished is difficult to see from the approach road near the Power Station. The exclusion zone is within the Power Station boundaries and there will be no public road closures.
- There will be no public access onto to the site as our prime concern is for the health and safety of everyone involved.

**When will the demolition be completed?**

- The full site will be cleared by 2021

**What is next for the site?**

In November 2018 site owner ENGIE UK announced plans to deliver an exciting new future for the former 1GW Coal-fired Power Station site through a mixed-use development. The development has the potential to include more than 2,000 new low-carbon homes, later living communities and a number of commercial buildings. A public consultation phase for the development was carried out and ENGIE submitted an outline planning application in May 2019.
